Australia reached the penultimate ticket to the World Cup by beating *Los Catrachos* in a 3-1 that endangers the job of their Coach Jorge Luis Pinto.

In Argentine soccer the Boca Junior beat the River Plate to be crowned Champion of the season 2016-17. After this season, we will see important changes, for 2017-2018. Will see the first tournament organized by the Argentine Superliga, reducing the number of teams participating in it.

In Spanish football, *Los Merengues* from the Real Madrid achieved the crown of the Spanish League and the Spanish Super Cup leaving Barcelona with the sub-championship on both occasions. However, the Copa del Rey got out of *Merengues* hands and Barcelona became Champion of it.

In the FIFA Intercontinental tournaments, the Club World Cup: the Real Madrid was crowned as a Champion, and left as sub-champion to Kashima Antlers from Japan. In 2018 we will see the Club World Cup in the cities of Abu Dhabi and Al Ain, with the participation of the Pachuca Club (Mex.) to represent the North and Central America region. While in South America, it is still to be determined who will attend as a representative.

The South American Tournament Champions from Copa Libertadores: Atlético Nacional de Colombia. Copa Sudamericana: Chapecoense (of Brazil and Championship of Honor). Recopa Sudamericana: Atlético Nacional de Colombia.

While the North and Central America Champions are Champions League: Club Pachuca (Mexico). The Champions of the League in Africa: Mamelodi Sundowns (South Africa). Asia: Jeonbuk Hyundai Motors (Japan) and Oceania: Auckland City FC (New Zealand)
